Introduction to Photography (Digital) Class

Program Description:

Throughout the four-week course, the class will cover techniques to "get out of auto" on their digital cameras to better photograph various subjects.

Students are required to have a digital camera of some kind. DSLR's (those with interchangeable lenses) and bridge/hybrid and advanced point and shoot cameras are welcome and encouraged. Basic point and shoot cameras are ok, but some settings covered throughout the course may not be applicable to them. The four sessions will each focus on a separate topic:

White balance and lighting-

This session will cover the importance of proper white balance in their photos to avoid being too warm or cool toned, or, alternatively, when to warm or cool a photo. It will also cover the importance of proper lighting and possible use of flash or other external lighting sources when necessary to avoid over exposed or under exposed photos.

Composition and cropping-

To get the best photo, it is sometimes necessary to capture the subject from a wider angle or distance the camera from the subject and then crop later- to ensure the whole subject is in frame. This session will also cover how to frame a subject (centered, left or right, rule of thirds) and the importance of background and complimentary items to the subject.

Focal lengths and lenses-

-Focal lengths of lenses determine how wide or how close a photo can look. This session will cover the importance of choosing lenses to get a desired effect and how to use the range, if possible, on that lens. These techniques will also be relevant to those with point and shoot cameras because they do have ranges already built into them, usually told in form of "_x zoom".

Camera Values-

Values of a camera include shutter speed, ISO, and aperture (or f-stop). This session will go over what these values control individually as well as how to use them all together. These settings may or may not be available to those with point and shoot cameras- it just depends on the type of point and shoot camera.
